We need your help in "getting the word out" about this effective outreach. This is one of our most exciting and rewarding efforts. VetNet is not intended to be an outreach to those in jails and prisons. It recognizes that many in the military can benefit from our curriculum and offers it "free" to all - active, reserve, or veterans as well as all members of the family. Young people often enlist as part of a search to find themselves and the discovery process continues for the rest of their lives. Our "Sense of Self" course is helpful to anyone and everyone.



Unfortunately, too many military marriages and families suffer along the way. Three NLB courses can bring light to cloudy issues . . . A Sense of Family, "Christian Marriage Skills," and *Parenting Matters* (including a *Children's Edition*)

suited for those between the ages of five to twelve. Self-study or the study-by-mail method provides an opportunity for confidential research at the pace of each learner. Each of the thirteen-lesson series can result in a Certificate of Achievement.

It is not uncommon for one to enter the military with unsettled personal issues, including addictions (chemical and/or sexual) and these can worsen with time. "Christians Against Substance Abuse" and Christians Against Sexual Addiction both utilize the Twelve Steps to recovery from a spiritual and Bible-based perspective. We also maintain a list of support groups in congregations throughout the nation. Our "Attitudes & Behaviors" course shows how we can

change behaviors by changing the way we think (Proverbs 23:7).

One thing the military provides is discipline and structure. This may have been lacking prior to enlistment. It can also present challenges upon departure, especially for those seeing combat. Post-traumatic stress can be a real nightmare. A growing number find relief turning to these NLB courses: "True Freedom," Managing My Anger, and "Managing My Dollar."

The greatest program or course of study will not help anyone unless pursued and lessons implemented. We have spent thousands on advertising, but the most powerful means is person-to-person or word-of-mouth. It is sometimes described as "one beggar telling another beggar where he found bread." The best favor you may do for one in the military is to introduce them to **VetNet**. To make this easier, we are enclosing a brochure to be given away or left in a public place.
