SPANISH LANGUAGE TOOLS

We are pleased to update readers on our ongoing progress to reach those who prefer to learn from curriculum in the Spanish language. As most know, the first seven NLB Spanish course versions remain in the 2000 format as produced at Harding University by freshman Wal-Mart scholars at zero cost to NLBM. Several of these courses were incomplete at that time and remain so. Newer and complete versions will be translated as time and funding allow.

Today, NLB's curriculum consists of fifteen courses, including the *Children's Edition*. Our current focus is on producing the newer series in Spanish. <u>Christians Against Substance Abuse</u> (CASA), the FamilyNet Series, the *Seeker* Bible Study Series, and "Managing My Anger" have been translated. Still needing to be translated is "Prisoners of Christ," <u>Christians Against Sexual Addictions</u>, Managing My Dollar, and the *Children's Edition*.





Efforts are underway to produce a video edition of "A Sense of Self" in cooperation with our great friends at Harding University. Each of the thirteen lessons will consist of two 30-minute sessions that can easily be used by themselves or in a "live" teaching environment or plugged in for viewings in faith-based or other pods. At the same time, Spanish versions are being recorded. This is a gigantic understanding. We need your help in prayer and significant financial support. If you desire more details, contact us.

Since this ministry graciously shares office space with the Kings Crossing Prison Ministries, we have access to

their Spanish tools. These studies currently consist of 7 courses:

"There <u>IS</u> a Better Way" (5 lessons)

"Prisoners of Hope" (5 lessons)

"Pathway to a Better Life" (10 lessons)

"Study of Baptism" (7 lessons)

"Freedom Steps" (12 lessons)

"Living the Better Way" (6 lessons)
"Firmly Rooted" (13 lessons)



NLB & "STUDY-BY-MAIL"

Hundreds of thousands in this country are studying our NLB



courses through the mail. This is a highly effective means of study for many reasons. The U.S. mail reaches some who are in physical places denied to most volunteers. Students study at their individual pace. Inperson teaching is frequently interrupted

but "despite rain, sleet, hail, snow," the mail gets delivered. Study by mail is steady and systematic – like laying bricks – one lesson at a time on top of another.

The downside is that it can get expensive. One way we help is by making a BCC (<u>Bible Correspondence Course</u>) version. The text is unchanged but with photos removed, the size is reduced to 50% of the original. Less paper, ink, weight, and postage spells "big savings." Contact us for copies.
