DEALING WITH THE RISING COST OF MINISTRY

Family Upreach has been extremely blessed since her beginning thirty-nine years ago but we now find ourselves forced to deal with the current financial realities of while continuing to do what we have been able to do for so long. Like all families following Covid-19, we are adjusting to the increased cost of *everything* from a first-class stamp to the price of a Bible. Paper cost has doubled (IF you can get it locally). Shipping is out of this world even if the destination is in Iowa. We are staring this because you need to know that Family Upreach will not be able to supply materials in the same manner as in the past.

We are counting the pennies required for each item. For instance, the same student workbook we used to

ask \$6 for (plus shipping), now cost us *twice* that amount. The World Bible School Bibles we used to get for \$3.50, now cost \$7.95. We fussed when we shipped a \$3.50 Bible to a prisoner and the postage alone was \$4.50. At the new rate, the total has jumped to \$15. We are looking into ways to reduce our overhead. This is not a retail business so, we are not interested in "making" a profit. But "Business Economics 101" teaches that we are going under if we keep *giving the store away*. These things are happening at the same time that doors previously slammed shut by the pandemic are opening wide again. Satan fights so hard because his back is to the wall and victory for us is nearer now than before. We will not quit. With help from above, we are pushing on.





It would be wonderful if we could produce a *cost of ministry* document immediately, but we ask for your prayers and patience. This will be a "work in progress" for some time. We may have to discontinue some items. Dr. H. M. Motsinger has been frequently quoted describing Family Upreach as a "curriculum-based ministry." Simply put, this means we research, develop, write, publish, and distribute spiritual and educational material to facilitate positive behavioral changes that "reconcile individuals to God, families, and society." Recently, we have launched into new mediums (videos and online accessibilities), recruiting and training of instructors, and re-entry.

While struggling to remain afloat, let us also recognize the sickness of our world and continue efforts to reach, redeem and restore the fallen. We seek more donors and resources. It is odd how much smaller a mountain seems in a time of abundance compared with its overwhelming height when funds are tight. Heavenly vision is required. We want to be prudent but not foolish or faithless. We realize that what we are experiencing is also being encountered by sister ministries. Please pray for us and for every good work. God is still good – all the time.
