
"DAY OF GIVING" — NOVEMBER 14TH Dr. Dale Underwood, NLBM President

COPING WITH NEW CORRESPONDENCE RULES

We are delighted to announce that prison ministries are cleared to return to supplying Bible correspondence materials and Bibles to inmates at their units in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. This will resolve the issue of students being able to return "test sheets" for grading and supplying "Certificates of Completion" when completing a course. However, individual letters (not a part of studies or with lessons) must continue to be mailed to Dallas for scanning to inmates' tablets. In such instances, address your correspondence to offenders in this way:

Youth Edition: "A Sense of Self"

Dr. Dale Underwood, NLBM President, is wrapping up the 8-lesson Youth Edition of *A Sense of Self* at this time. As soon as



possible, this new curriculum will also be produced on Flash Drives like all the NLB courses. This work was initiated at the request of a Tarrant County (Fort Worth) judge facing a high turnover rate. Thus, it consists of only 8 lessons a not thirteen.

It is also an excellent choice to easily to utilized as Bible School curriculum in local churches.

In addition to 25 years in Youth Ministry, Dr. Underwood worked as an administrator for 10+ years at the Gulf Coast Trade Center near Huntsville, the only educational-vocational program of its kind in Texas for adjudicated youth. A license for this Youth Edition is available for a one-time fee of \$75. As with other NLB courses, this allows the license-holder to make unlimited reproductions.
